<b>BIRD SPECIES</b>	<b>BIRD CALL SOUNDS LIKE:</b>
<b>AMERICAN ROBIN</b>	a clear caroling with rising and falling short phrases and some prolonged notes of <i>tyeep</i> and <i>tut-tut-tut</i>
<b>AMERICAN CROW</b>	a harsh <i>caw caw</i>
<b>NORTHERN CARDINAL</b>	<i>cheer-o-cheer-o-what-what</i> or <i>pretty-pretty-pretty</i>
<b>BLUE JAY</b>	a harsh <i>jeeah</i> or <i>jay</i>
<b>WHITE-BREASTED NUTHATCH</b>	a nasal <i>ank-ank-ank-ank</i>
<b>GRAY CATBIRD</b>	a cat-like <i>meow</i>
<b>COMMON YELLOWTHROAT</b>	a bright, rapid <i>whichity-witchitywhichity-witch</i>
<b>NORTHERN FLICKER</b>	a loud <i>wick wick-wick-wick-wick</i> and a squeaky <i>flick-a-flicka-a-flicka</i>
<b>MOURNING DOVE</b>	a mournful <i>who whoo .. whoo whoo</i>
<b>BARRED OWL</b>	a barking call that sounds like <i>Who cooks for you? Who cooks for you all?</i>
<b>RED-TAILED HAWK</b>	a high-pitched squeal slurring downward <i>keer-r-r</i>

### Birds that say their name:

<b>BIRD SPECIES</b>	<b>BIRD CALL SOUNDS LIKE:</b>
<b>BLACK-CAPPED CHICKADEE</b>	two calls: <i>chickadee-dee-dee</i> or a clear whistled <i>fee bee</i>
<b>KILLDEER</b>	says its name: <i>kill-deer. kill-deer</i>
<b>WHIP-POOR-WILL</b>	heard at night: <i>whip-poor-will. whip-poor-will</i>
