NORTHERN CARDINAL	cheer-o-cheer-o-what-what or pretty-pretty- pretty
BLUE JAY	a harsh <i>jeeah</i> or <i>jay</i>
WHITE-BREASTED NUTHATCH	a nasal ank-ank-ank
GRAY CATBIRD	a cat-like <i>meow</i>
COMMON YELLOWTHROAT	a bright, rapid <i>whichity-witchitywhichity-witch</i>
NORTHERN FLICKER	a loud wick wick-wick-wick-wick and a squeaky flick-a-flicka-a-flicka
MOURNING DOVE	a mournful <i>whoo whoo whoo whoo</i>
BARRED OWL	a barking call that sounds like <i>Who cooks for</i> you? Who cooks for you all?
<b>RED-TAILED HAWK</b>	a high-pitched squeal slurring downward <i>keeer-r-r</i>

## Birds that say their name:

BIRD SPECIES	<b>BIRD CALL SOUNDS LIKE:</b>
BLACK-CAPPED CHICKADEE	two calls: <i>chickadee-dee-dee</i> or a clear whistled <i>fee bee</i>
KILLDEER	says its name: kill-deer. kill-deer
WHIP-POOR-WILL	heard at night: whip-poor-will. whip-poor-will
