

On Sunday, an additional trip visited Saylorville and Marsh Farm Wetland (Eric Ollie and Matt Wetrich). The weather bounced back on Sunday, with cool temperatures, lots of sun, and LIGHT WINDS. Many of the species that were hard to hear or get good looks at on Saturday were much more cooperative the next day. That really lifted everyone's spirits and we ended the weekend with 190 species! That may be a Spring Meeting record. Here are a few of the highlights:

A bewildering miss was Orchard Oriole. Trumpeter Swan and Forster's Tern were also surprising no-shows. The Ledges group ran out of time to look for the Loggerhead Shrike pair that are sometimes seen south of the park.

With that said, the feedback received was how much fun everyone had in the field. Tearing folks away from the warblers was a tough chore for the trip leaders, but a fun one to have.

Afternoon Sessions

The afternoon meetings were well attended and well received. Kelly McKay's overview on how window collisions are affected by building siting and glass area was very interesting. It was a very meticulous study, and the process and planning that went into it was very informative. Steve Dinsmore followed with a talk on citizen science and bird monitoring. He focused on the challenges of using "lay" person data in three initiatives: Breeding Bird Surveys, Christmas Bird Counts and eBird. All three have pros and cons when it comes drawing scientific conclusions from the data. It definitely sparked a lot of discussion. Hank Zaletel then took the group (well, not literally) on a winter trip to Sax-Zim Bog in northern Minnesota. The Zaletels have gone on this Carroll CCB-

sponsored trip three times with Matt Wetrich. Hank had a highly entertaining presentation on the wonderful birds that were seen and the occasional logistical challenges they encountered. Tyler Harms and Paul Skrade gave a short overview of the online survey presented to Listserve members last fall. They'll be publishing full results soon. A short business meeting wrapped up the afternoon session. Elections were held and the results are as follows: Stuart Sparkman's time as Secretary was up and he will be replaced by Rex Rundquist. Karen Viste-Sparkman's term as Board Member also expired and she will be replaced by Eric Ollie. Candace Havely and Linda Rudolph both agreed to serve a second term as Board Members. Congratulations to the new IOU board members and a well-deserved "thank you" to Stuart and Karen for their service these last four years.

Evening Session

Our keynote speaker, Mary Gustafson, came up from the Rio Grande Valley to talk about bird conservation initiatives in Mexico, especially with Chihuahuan Desert grasslands. She focused on the efforts between Canada, the United States and Mexico to conserve and improve breeding, migratory and wintering habitats for grassland birds. The decline in the number of many grassland species in the last 50 years is truly staggering. Some have declined over 90%. Mary told us she was amazed when she discovered that IOU, Iowa Audubon and Iowa DNR have all contributed to Southern Wings and other initiatives for grassland conservation. Nearly all the other participants in those initiatives are big government agencies or national conservation organizations. She heartily congratulated us for recognizing the challenges "our" grassland birds face on their Mexican wintering grounds. She spoke at length on one of the projects in which we invested, the El Tokio Grasslands in Nuevo Leon where over 100,000 acres have been protected. It was a great presentation and rekindled (or kindled for the first time) for many, the urge to go birding in Mexico.

Many thanks to the speakers and field trip leaders. The presentations and field trips were top-notch. Also, many thanks to John and Bob Cecil for all their hard work in putting on the Silent Auction. It raised over \$400. Doug

Harr and Karen Disbrow again supported the IOU sales booth. I especially want to thank Hank Zaletel, Shane Patterson, and the rest of Big Bluestem Audubon for organizing the facilities and field trips. It was a very successful meeting. There seemed to be a real camaraderie within the attendees, and several folks commented that it was an enjoyable and birdy weekend.

I hope you can join us in Spirit Lake on August 26-28 for our fall meeting. Kevin Karlson will be the keynote speaker. Kevin is a noted field trip leader and wildlife photographer. He's also a prolific birding author and is the co-author of *Birding by Impression: A Different Approach to Knowing and Identifying Birds* and *The Shorebird Guide*. His keynote presentation will be about the former and he will also lead an afternoon session on shorebird ID. Mark your calendars and we'll see you in the great Northwest in August!

IOU Fall Meeting Meet Us At Spirit Lake August 26-28

The 2016 Fall IOU Meeting will be held August 26-28 along the shores of West Okoboji Lake at the University of Iowa's Lakeside Lab. We will be based in the heart of Iowa's Great Lakes region, one of the top birding destinations in the state. The number and quality of wetlands is unsurpassed in Iowa. Along with the more expected marsh species, the area is hosting the following nesting/ summering birds this year: Red-necked, Eared & Western Grebe; American & Least Bittern; Common Gallinule; Black & Forster's Tern; and Great-tailed Grackle. The wetlands should provide a lot of good habitat for migrating shorebirds, so they'll be a prime target. The large area of grassland includes some the finest remaining native prairies in Iowa. While not as common as other habitats, there are some nice woodlands in the area that support a surprising number of species. Late August is a great time to visit the area. Fall migration will be underway, yet most of the breeding birds should still be around.



The banquet will be held at the nearby Village West Resort.
Our keynote speaker is Kevin Karlson from Cape May, New Jersey. Kevin is a prolific author and his keynote speech will center on his latest book, Birding by Impression: A Different Approach

to Knowing and Identifying Birds. Kevin has also helped author shorebird guides and will be leading a shorebird ID session on Saturday afternoon.

Kevin Karlson is an accomplished birder, professional tour leader and wildlife photographer who has published four books and many bird and nature related articles for magazines and journals over the last 20 years. He is a regular presence at Bird and Nature festivals in North America, where he gives keynote presentations and workshops on bird identification and appreciation, as well as photo instruction. His photos can be seen in numerous locations, including his website kevintkarlson.com. Kevin is a co-author of The Shorebird Guide (Houghton Mifflin Co. 2006), and the author/photographer of a two photography books titled The Birds of Cape May and Visions: Earth's Elements in Bird and Nature Photography (Schiffer Publishing, 2010, 2012). His most recent book with wife and co-author Dale Rosselet, Birding by Impression: A Different Approach to Knowing and Identifying Birds was released in May 2015 in the Roger Tory Peterson

Reference Series at Houghton Mifflin Harcourt Publishers.

Kevin recently produced five photographic laminated foldout guides for Quick Reference Publishing of Florida (Raptors of Eastern and Western North America (2012), Waterfowl of North America (2013) and Shorebirds of North America (2014), and just recently Warblers of North America (2016). A former photo editor for North American Birds, he also wrote the Birder's ID column and served as an Advisory Board member for Wild Bird Magazine from 1992 – 2012. He currently leads several bird tours each year and a birding cruise with Dale Rosselet for Carefree Birding of Florida to six countries (www.carefreebirding.com). Locations for upcoming birding and/or photography tours include Thailand (January 2017 for Sunrise Birding of Connecticut), the Galapagos Islands (October 2016 for NJ Audubon and Wildside Nature Tours), and Kenya/Tanzania in October 2017 for Sunrise Birding (not yet posted).

Birding by Impression: A Different Approach to Knowing and Identifying Birds

This keynote talk shares a new slant to field identification that Kevin Karlson and his co-author and wife Dale Rosselet developed called Birding by Impression: A Different Approach to Knowing and Identifying Birds, which is the title of their new book in the Roger Tory Peterson Reference Series at Houghton Mifflin Harcourt Publishers (April 2015). The focus of this multimedia presentation encourages a conscious assessment of body shape and physical features of birds prior to analyzing traditional ID field marks. This results in a more holistic approach to birding that includes right and left brain strengths to enhance your birding skills as well as a greater awareness of bird's behavior, movements and natural history rather than just a check on your personal list.

A short description of Birding by Impression is followed by unique digitized or real life photos from their new book that encourages the audience to spot differences between similar species in direct side-by-side comparison. This exciting ID approach concentrates on basic impressions of size, body shape, structural features and motion to form an accurate first impression of birds, with analysis of plumage details and bare parts to follow. Several videos and a musical ending allow for a relaxed appreciation of the beauty and intriguing nature of birds.

2015 Statewide Listing

In 2015, a first record of Brown Booby, found by Steve Dinsmore at Red Rock Reservoir and documented by Dinsmore, Kevin Murphy, Chris Edwards, Bill Scheible, Paul Roisen, Ray Cummins, Pam Allen and Reid Allen, enabled many of the top birders to increment their state lists. It was seen by eight of the top ten listers and at least seven other people. Another rarity added to at least six state lists was a Dickinson County Townsend's Warbler documented by Lee Schoenewe, Joe Jungers and Paul Roisen.

All listers appreciate the efforts of those who document the casual and accidental birds that show up in Iowa. These ultra-rare birds should appear on the lists published below only after passing records committee review. Ideally, all birders would document all casual and accidental birds seen (for ornithological reasons), but a lister does not need to have documented a bird in order to count it, as long as someone has documented it, and the subsequent review resulted in acceptance. Agreeing to this condition enables all participants to have confidence that list standards are both uniform and high. Since taking on the responsibility of compiling this information, I have tried to promote this spirit of cooperation and dedication to maintaining high standards, and have been encouraged by positive responses from many IOU members who participate in listing.

Following are the rules Chris set for himself: Must identify the bird by hearing a recognizable sound produced by the bird – song, call, drumming, etc. Many of the birds were also seen and identified visually, but I had to be able to answer this question affirmatively: "Would I have identified this bird without seeing it?"

Must hear the bird live in the field within the State of Iowa. Cannot use unattended recording of bird sounds for later identification, for example overnight recording of nocturnal flight calls.

Cannot use playback or vocal mimicry to elicit a response from a bird. I did sometimes listen to recordings, in the field or at home, to confirm the identify of a bird I heard, similar to how one would use a field guide.

Birds can be counted even if they are not identified to species, provided no other members of that group are counted. For example, I counted Snow/Ross's Goose, gull species, hummingbird species, and longspur species.

2015 Big Days

There were three Big Days conducted in 2015, including first county Big Days for Winneshiek County and Dallas County. These bring the total to 38 Iowa counties now with at least one Big Day record.

Listing Guidelines

List totals are published here for current members of the Iowa Ornithologists' Union. Publishing totals provides a public exposure of birding activity for those who wish to participate. In doing so, birders see what is possible and some find motivation for getting out, looking for birds, and maybe exploring new areas. In turn, this generates data for field reports and adds to our knowledge of the distributions of birds in Iowa.

Lists, themselves, are not considered scientific data sets. Nevertheless, while members are encouraged to keep whatever personal lists they wish to, those submitted for publication here should conform to certain standards so that the totals are comparable across all contributors. Lists should be of live birds seen in Iowa and judged to be wild and of natural origin. Birds classified "casual" or "accidental" in Iowa should only appear on lists after the particular bird's presence has been reviewed and accepted by the records committee.

The **Iowa State Life List** is the list of all bird species seen in the state of Iowa and conforming to the standards above.

The **Personally Found List** is the subset of the Iowa State Life List in which species were personally found by the lister. "Personally found" means the lister found the representative bird with no prior knowledge, current or historical, of its presence. This list differs from all other IOU listing categories since, in other categories, a bird initially found by others may be counted on those lists.

The Annual List is the list of birds seen in the calendar year.

The **Yardlist** is the list of birds seen in or from the personal residence of the lister. A bird counts if it is seen on the property even though the observer may not have been on the property at the time, or if the bird is seen anywhere (e.g. in the sky) while the observer is present on the property. The totals in this category are difficult to compare, since not all properties are equal.

The **Big Day** is a list of birds seen in the course of a single day (midnight to midnight) by a group of people (more than one) in a particular geographic region. The IOU publishes any Big Days reported in Iowa, but keeps permanent records for County Big Days and record Big Days by month. Any Big Day conducted across more than one county is considered a statewide Big Day.

Due to limitations in space and time invested in compiling list information, the IOU publishes list totals, not the lists themselves. However, this does not mean that the contents of lists are protected or secret, and by participating, members agree to share this information upon request by the IOU or other listers.

2015 County Listing

At least 37 people shared individual totals for at least one county. Six birders, Pam Allen, Reid Allen, Steve Dinsmore, Jay Gilliam, Mark Proescholdt and Paul Roisen report having seen at least 50 species of birds in each of Iowa's 99 counties. Roisen joined Dinsmore as the only listers to see at least 100 species in every county, but has a way to go to achieve Steve's minimum count of 151 (Clayton County). Keith Dyche was the most active county lister in 2015, adding an amazing 1591 ticks to his totals.

IOU News – the End of an Era

In 1985 Hank and Linda Zaletel launched the very first IOU newsletter as a means to communicate with the membership about upcoming activities, special birding events, and stories about birds and birding. The intent was to supplement Iowa Bird Life with less technical information of interest to

all. The Zaletels remained as editors for 16 years! In 2001 the editorship was capably assumed by Paul Hertzel until the Spring 2008 when, as co-editor with Harley Winfrey, Paul began to transition out of these responsibilities. This transition came to an abrupt halt when Harley's employment took him out of state so Hertzel remained as temporary editor until the fall of 2009 when Bill Scheible graciously agreed to became a temporary co-editor with Paul. Bill solicited and wrote the

content while Paul took on the responsibility of the layout and printing. By the summer of 2010 the publications committee had finally achieved finding permanent co-editors, John and Anna Bissell. With John as the active IOU member and birder and Anna skilled in creating print publications, IOU News was in good hands. This issue, however, is their final effort as well as the final issue of the IOU newsletter. For that reason,

it is being mailed to all members. When John and Anna submitted their resignation this spring. it became a time for the publications committee to assess our current publications. Like the RBA phone line in the past, had other communication venues now replaced the original need for IOU News? That sense of an Iowa birding community that was fostered through the newsletter has become more fragmented but may also be reaching more people today. We now have the website and listsery; an IOU Facebook

page and Twitter account. Even our own newsletter, which was designed to be a printed document delivered to a mailbox, is now read on-line by a majority of our members. We live in an age of instant communication so getting contributions of articles for publication has become more and more difficult over the past several years and is probably the single largest frustration of a newsletter editor. Our conclusion was that rather than spend the money on expensive publishing software and finding a new editor with specialized publishing skills, it was time to put IOU News to bed for the last time.

There are some exciting new projects in front of us, however. Since all but 26 IOU members have email addresses, most members will begin receiving regular and short e-newsletters with items of interest from our new communications committee. If you are one of those 26, maybe you can find a friend who is willing to let you use their email and print you a copy. Of course making certain your email is current is of utmost importance as well. Login to the IOU website and check it or send your current email to Cecille Thompson < cecillethompson@gmail.com> who can update it for you. Using electrons for communication saves trees, money (which can be used for our great projects), and time. Physical mailing will now be limited to meeting registration forms sent to only

those with no other way to receive that information. The next time you see one of these people, be sure to thank them for their fantastic years of service to you - the IOU membership: Hank and Linda Zaletel, Paul Hertzel, Harley Winfrey, Bill Scheible, John and Anna Bissell.
